Mud The Mesa project is a collaborative effort created by and for the Taos Mesa community to involve local builders and architects in helping educate people about the accessibility of low-income, sustainable, earthen building techniques and housing amidst the unprecedented housing crisis in Taos, New Mexico



NATURES RIGHTS PROGRAM

Creating protective rights for rivers and nature is a primary focus for E.A.R.T.H and its Nature's Rights Program. The environmental laws are no longer working. We have been educating people on the importance of giving rights to the environment.



WATER SOLUTIONS PROGRAM

We seek to provide clean water to communities who have been directly impacted by the long-term effects of colonialism and industrialization through state-of-the-art water technologies, water catchment systems, and responsibly dug wells, and we seek to educate communities about sustainable practices such as water filtrations, sustainable practices, and soil-water retention.



Free Annual Earth day Festival

On April 22nd, every year at Kit Carson Park we will join together in celebration with the Mayor of Taos for a cherry tree-planting ceremony, environmental speakers and panels on the subjects of local water and soil restoration, healing arts activities, activities for children, vendors, and musical acts.



PICK UP EARTH PROGRAM

In 2021 and 2022 we cleaned up dozens of miles along rivers, lakes, and roads across Arizona and New Mexico. We believe we can help the environment through actions such as Pick-Up Earth, which aims to remove toxic microplastics from waterways and agricultural areas in a fun and engaging way.



With Earth Theater, expect fun, music, clowning, and family-friendly productions to celebrate and educate the community! We are also developing an earth-based live-action-roleplay inspired to engage children and young adults with the natural world around them.



In 2022, E.A.R.T.H.'s Water Solutions program brought state-of-the-art NASA filters and installed 3 wells in two highly remote Huni Kuin villages in Acre, Brazil. Our goal is to maintain a relationship with the people of Acre and provide water solutions for these communities as needed and wanted.



RIO GRANDE WATER WALK

In 2022, The Nature's Rights Program initiated a walk along the Rio Grande River from Santa Fe, NM to the Colorado border, to bring awareness to the need for the Rights of Nature for the Rio Grande. This walk will continue in future years as an educational movement.
